ORDINANCE NO. 2022-645

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CHAPTER 152 OF ITS CODE OF ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING MIXED USE AS A PERMITTED USE IN THE CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT

THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES DOES ORDAIN: (deleted material is lined out; new material is underlined; sections and subsections which are not being amended are omitted):

Section 1. § 152.02: DEFINITIONS.

MIXED USE DOWNTOWN: A building that includes a combination of office, retail, residential or commercial uses within one structure or building.

Section 2. § 152.22: CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT.

- (B) Permitted principal uses. The following uses shall be permitted:
 - (40) Mixed Use Downtown, subject to the following:
 - a. Exclusive of required entrances, the residential use may occupy no portion of the front 50% of the first story floor area along the front building line. For corner lots or lots that abut an alley, the standard shall be applied to one street frontage as determined by the Zoning Administrator.
 - b. Residential uses shall be provided separate entrances and separately identified parking stalls.
 - (40) (41) Mortuary or undertaking establishments;
 - (41) (42) Motels and hotels;
 - (42) (43) Newsstands and tobacco shops;
 - (43) (44) Offices, professional;
 - (44) (45) Optical stores;
 - (45) (46) Paint and wallpaper stores;
 - (46) (47) Parking lots, ramps and garages other than those accessory to a principal use the parking and storage of private passenger vehicles only;
 - (47) (48) Pet shops;
 - (48) (49) Phonographs, record and sheet music stores;
 - (49) (50) Photography studios;
 - (50) (51) Physical culture and health services, reducing salons and masseurs;

(52)	(53) Post offices;
(53)	(54) Plumbing sales stores;

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CHAPTER 152 OF ITS CODE OF ORDINANCES EXEMPTING THE CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT FROM PARKING REQUIREMENTS

THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES DOES ORDAIN: (deleted material is lined out; new material is underlined; sections and subsections which are not being amended are omitted):

Section 1. § 152.41: REGULATIONS; GENERAL

- (L) Off-street parking and loading-unloading space requirements.
 - (1) Parking space requirements. The required parking and loading spaces shall be provided on the premises of each use. Each parking space shall contain a minimum area of not less than 300 square feet including access drives, and a width of not less than 9 feet, and a depth of not less than 20 feet. The minimum number of required off-street parking spaces for various uses shall be as follows: except for the Central Business District where all non-residential uses shall be exempt from the following parking requirements:

THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES DOES ORDAIN: (deleted material is lined out; new material is underlined; sections and subsections which are not being amended are omitted):

Section 1. § 152.41: REGULATIONS; GENERAL

- (L) Off-street parking and loading-unloading space requirements.
- (1)(a) Apartments: 1-1/2 parking spaces for each apartment, except housing for the elderly projects, which shall provide 3/10 parking space for each dwelling unit; and any dwelling unit in the CBD district which requires 1 (one) designated parking stall per unit;

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its publication.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CHAPTER 152 OF ITS CODE OF ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING SIZE REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES

THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES DOES ORDAIN: (deleted material is lined out; new material is underlined; sections and subsections which are not being amended are omitted):

Section 1. § 152.41: REGULATIONS; GENERAL

(C) Accessory Buildings.

(3) (a) A detached accessory building shall not be located in any required front yard. Detached accessory buildings in residential districts shall not exceed 1 story or 16 feet in height and shall not be greater than 1,000 square feet in area and cannot occupy more than 10% of the lot area. The total square footage of all detached accessory structures shall not be equal to or greater than the footprint of the principal structure.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-649

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CHAPTER 152 OF ITS CODE OF ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING AN R4 MULTIPLE FAMILY APARTMENT ZONING DISTRICT

THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES DOES ORDAIN: (deleted material is lined out; new material is underlined; sections and subsections which are not being amended are omitted):

Section 1. § 152.19.5 – MULTIPLE-FAMILY APARTMENT DISTRICT.

- (A) <u>Purpose</u>. The R-4 District is intended to permit multi-family dwelling units of 12-40 units housed in one structure.
- (B) <u>Permitted principal uses</u>. Within an R-4 District, unless otherwise provided by this chapter, no building or land shall be used except for the following:
 - (1) Apartment buildings consisting of 12-40 dwelling units.
- (C) <u>Dimensional standards.</u>
 - (1) Maximum density of 16 units per acre.
 - (2) Front yard setback of at least 30 feet for the principal structure.
 - (3) Side yard setback of at least 10 feet, or 25 feet for corner side yards for the principal structure.
 - (4) <u>Setbacks from structures in R-1, R-1M, R1-O districts shall be 30 feet from district lines.</u>
 - (5) Rear yard setback of at least 30 feet for the principal structure.
 - (6) Maximum height of 45 feet.
 - (7) Building coverage shall not exceed 45% of the lot area.
 - (8) Shall provide 1.5 parking spaces per dwelling unit.
 - (9) Required parking shall have a 10 foot setback from any property line.
- (D) Performance standards.
 - (1) <u>Buildings shall be constructed of high-quality materials</u>. <u>Primary materials allowed are</u> as follows:
 - (a) Brick
 - (b) Natural Stone
 - (c) Wood consisting of horizontal lap siding with a painted surface
 - (d) <u>Precast concrete units and concrete block, provided that surfaces are molded, serrated or treated with a textured material.</u>
 - (e) Transparent glass
 - (f) Vinyl or fiberboard siding
 - (g) Other materials as approved by the Planning Commission.
 - (3) The following materials are prohibited:

- (a) Plain or painted concrete block
- (b) Plain precast concrete panels
- (c) Prefabricated steel or sheet metal panels
 (d) Aluminum, fiberglass or asphalt siding.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its publication.

Summary of the Issu	ρ								

Existing commercial building owner has requested a forgivable loan from the EDA Commercial Rehabilitation Fund

Background

The applicants would like to make significant long-term improvements to their buildings to enhance their business.

Based on the Committee's review of the documentation, they determined the project for the Good Sport Bar and Grill building met the eligibility requirements of the St. Charles Commercial Rehabilitation Fund. The funds will be used towards replacing the awnings on both sides of the building. The total project costs were \$10,800 therefore the request is \$5000. Because the project meets all eligibility requirements for the program and there is remaining 2022 funding in the program, Council's approval would be contingent on final review by the EDA at their next meeting.

Funding

Approval will require \$5000 from the EDA Funds. Council action will serve to authorize the loan. Loan will be structured as a 5 year forgivable loan with 20% forgiven each year.

Recommendation

The EDA approved by motion, the following recommendations:

- 1. To approve Request # contingent on final review by the EDA as requested and described above.
- 2. To authorize the staff to prepare all necessary loan documents.
