#### 9. Commercial Rehabilitation Fund Request - #01-23

Cris Gastner from CEDA presented a request from Austin Fohrman of Versatile Woodwork to receive a \$5,000.00 forgivable loan for a façade improvement project on his business downtown. Mr. Gastner stated that the total project estimate was between \$20,000-\$30,000. The loan is fully forgiven if Mr. Fohrman owns the property for five years. The EDA made a recommendation to the Council to approve the request. Motion to approve: **Dave Braun**

#### 10. Assistance Request for Downtown Residential Rental Project - #02-23

Cris Gastner presented a recommendation from the EDA Commission to approve \$40,000 in assistance to Mak Vafaei for his residential rental project. The project itself will include nine market-rate rental units and two commercial storefronts along Whitewater Ave. Mr. Gastner stated the recommendation is to use reserves in the EDA Fund to facilitate the forgivable loan. The intention is for the EDA to make the loan, the General Fund accept the additional tax revenues, and then for the EDA to make a request in that amount to replenish their fund. Additional discussion occurred regarding payouts in phases, which would be based on percentages of the building's completion. The development agreement would also establish a sunset period of 24-months, which could be extended if mutually agreed upon. The sunset period puts a timeframe on when the project should be completed. If the project doesn't meet an identified threshold by the sunset date the project would not receive additional funding.

#### 1. ESTABLISH QUORUM/CALL TO ORDER and ROLL CALL

Quorum was established with Mayor Schaber calling the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

#### 2. BUSINESS

County Assessor John Conway and Lindsey Brandt (Appraiser) presented information to the Board of Equalization on the assessment trends countywide and specifically in St. Charles.

Property-owners Pam and Dave Tesch, Sally Haley and Brent DeCook asked questions regarding the valuation of their properties. Each will meet with the Assessor and if they would like to pursue a valuation change, they would need to attend the Winona County Board of Equalization meeting.

Property-owner Brandon Hutkowski (Parcel ID: 29.074.0190) expressed concern of the valuation of his property. He stated his house is a two-bedroom and two-bathroom house and that his property is being valued the same as those with five-bedrooms and three-bathrooms. Mr. Conway explained that the valuation is derived from comparable sales in the neighborhood but agreed that the valuation may be a little high. Mr. Conway stated the initial valuation was set at \$427,000 and that after speaking to Mr. Hutkowski, he lowered the valuation to \$417,500. Mr. Hutkowski believes this is still too high and requested that the valuation be lowered. The Council discussed the matter and made a motion. Motion to lower the valuation of parcel ID: 29.074.0190 to \$385,000: Wayne Getz Seconded by: John Steffel No further discussion. Motion declared carried.

Property-owner Mitch Walch wanted to appeal the classification of parcel ID: 29.099.0130 from Residential to Agricultural. However, this needs to occur at the Winona County meeting. He also questioned the valuation of parcel ID: 29.099.0131where he only has a foundation. Mr. Conway provided an explanation on how the valuation was reached. The Council saw no need to adjust the valuation.

# A Resolution Approving A Seven-Day County Fair Temporary On-Sale Intoxicating Liquor License

**WHEREAS,** the Winona County Agricultural & Industrial Fair Association is submitting an application to the City of St. Charles in order to sell Intoxicating Liquor at the Winona County Fairgrounds on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday July 12-16, 2023.

**WHEREAS**, the entire perimeter of the site not on the side of the grandstands must be enclosed by a row of safety fencing, each row at least 4 feet in height. If Lessee wishes to use a barrier other than safety fencing, alternative materials with similar safety qualities may be pre-approved by the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the entire licensed site must be closely monitored by the licensee to ensure that no one leaves the premises with an alcoholic beverage in hand and/or passes such a beverage to anyone off the site; and

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, MINNESOTA that:

1. The Council of the City of St. Charles hereby approves the Temporary On-Sale Intoxicating Liquor License submitted by the Winona County Agricultural & Industrial Fair Association to the City of St. Charles.




